

CLASS NOTICES

Reading

All children will read for at least 10 minutes every day in school and we advise parents/guardians to listen to your child read at home for **10 minutes a day, at least 5 days a week**. They will also be heard read by an adult at least once a week. Please ensure your child is reading a book appropriate for their level.

PE

ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

<p>English</p> 	<p>In English, we will be reading 'The Wolf Wilder' by Katherine Rundell. https://www.booktrust.org.uk/book/t/the-wolf-wilder/ Click on this link to find out more information about the book. We will be writing suspense narratives based on a clip of 'Alma,' as well as writing non-chronological reports and exploring poetry.</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>In Maths, we will be carrying on with division, understanding how to divide larger numbers by large two-digit numbers (long division). We will then move onto fractions, where will be learning how to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions as well as converting fractions and finding their simplest forms. And finally looking at converting measurements.</p>
<p>Science</p> 	<p>In Science, we are going to learn about living things and their habitats. We shall be exploring different ways of classifying animals, food webs, micro-organisms, habitats in our local environment and how animals different adaptations to survive in their environment.</p>
<p>Computing</p> 	<p>In Computing, we will be learning how to make a good website, understanding what is key to a website and which layout is sufficient enough to make a website work. We will also be looking into copyright, and understanding whether this is right or wrong.</p>
<p>R.E.</p> 	<p>Our Key Question in RE will be: What matters most to Christians and Humanists? Children will investigate different religious (Christianity) and non-religious (Humanists) groups, finding out about their way of life. Pupils will begin to understand that not all people are religious and they will begin to build up an understanding of the concepts of justice, fairness and forgiveness.</p>

ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

<p>Geography and History</p> 	<p>In Geography, children will be learning about the Northern and Southern Hemispheres, particularly the Arctic and Antarctica regions. They will be comparing the two regions, finding out what is similar and different. They will also be understanding what a 'midnight sun' is and how this affects the hemispheres. In History, children will be learning about Shackleton's journey.</p>
<p>Music</p> 	<p>In Music, children will be learning all about Jazz music; children will listen to different styles of Jazz music, and answer questions surrounding the songs. They will learn how to play the Classroom Jazz music, which comes from Charanga, using glockenspiels.</p>
<p>DT/Art</p> 	<p>In D&T, the children will know that structures can be strengthened by manipulating materials and shapes. To understand what a 'footprint plan' is and that in the real world, design, can impact users in positive and negative ways. They will also know that a prototype is a cheap model to test a design idea.</p>
<p>P F</p> 	<p>In PE, we will be learning different volleyball skills. The children will be able to strike the object accurately aiming for a specific place in order to make it difficult for the opponent to return. Also, to have a concrete understanding that points are awarded when the equipment hits the floor (usually more than once), the equipment hits the net or misses the wall and when the ball hits an area outside of the court boundaries.</p>
<p>Spanish</p> 	<p>In Spanish, we will be learning about school life. In particular, children will be able to share and express their opinions on school and make comparison in conversation.</p>
